AZUSA STREET MISSION ANNOUNCES WEEKEND OF PRAYER FOR REVIVAL, TRAINING, AND SERVICE IN DOWNTOWN LOS ANGELES

LOS ANGELES - The Azusa Street Mission & Historical Society will host a powerful weekend of worship, prayer, prophetic training and service in downtown Los Angeles, February 22 – 23, 2013. Apostle Berry announced today that this will be a time for believers to gather in humble adoration and expectancy to experience an outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

“We are living in an exciting time, and declaring a call for believers to come together to seek God for revival, be equipped for service, and to serve humanity,” said Apostle Berry. The weekend kicks off with all night prayer at the historic Bonnie Brae House on February 22. This house is considered the birth place of the 1906 Azusa Street Revival where believers ignited a movement known as Pentecostalism, the world’s fastest-growing branch of Christianity. Pastor Ed Smith, Zoe Christian Fellowship, and Prophet Chad Taylor, Consuming Fire, are among the many special guests that will lead those gathered in worship, prayer, and prophetic intercession for Los Angeles and the nation.

On February 23, following the all night prayer service, participants are invited to serve the Skid Row community by ministering to the homeless, praying for the community, and trash removal. “We are called to serve,” Apostle Berry stated, “and our prayer is ‘send out laborers into His harvest’ (Luke 10:2).”

The weekend ends with prophetic training by Prophet Chad Taylor at the Azusa Street Mission in Little Tokyo. All events are free and open to the public.
